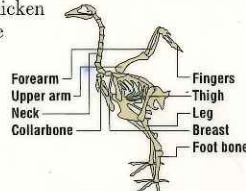

ANSWERS:

PAGE 3: Which two American explorers turned into fossil hunters on their famous 1804-1806 journey? Meriwether Lewis and William Clark found, but didn't recognize, dinosaur bones in the cliffs of Montana. They figured the bones belonged to a fish or elephant.

PAGE 5: Some fossilized seashells have ended up on the tops of mountains. How? The seashells were once on the bottom of an ocean. Earthquakes and volcanoes kept shifting and lifting the ocean floor. After millions of years, the ocean floor rose high enough to be a mountain top.

PAGE 7: Build a chicken skeleton. Compare your skeleton bone-for-bone to this illustration.

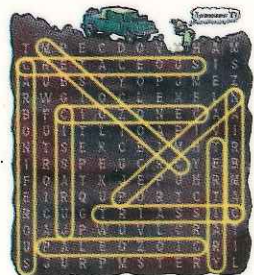


PAGE 8: What part of your body is already made of stone? Your bones. They are partly made of the mineral apatite, also called calcium phosphate.

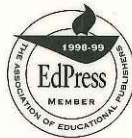
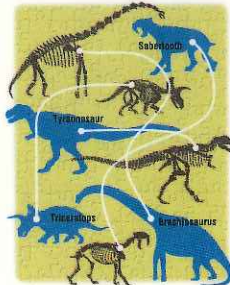
